If you or someone you know was abused as a child or young person by an adult, you are encouraged to notify appropriate civil authorities of that abuse. The Diocese is committed to helping prevent the abuse or neglect of children and young people and to assist those who have suffered harm as a result of such abuse.

**PASTOR'S COLUMN**



The month of November begins with the celebration of All Saints and All Souls Day.

This sets the tone for the rest of the month as we pray for the dead. The Catechism teaches, "From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead." (CCC 1032)

Here are a couple of ideas for your family to pray for the dead this month of November:

-Visit a cemetery – It is a corporal work of mercy to bury the dead, but also praiseworthy to pray for them. You can search online for the Order of Prayers for Visiting a Cemetery from the official "Book of Blessings" or you can find it on the parish website.

-The cemetery is also a great place to meditate on Christ's Second Coming and the resurrection of all who have died. Read out loud the Resurrection narrative from one of the Gospels (Matt 28:1-15; Mark 16:1-18; Luke 24:1-49; John 20:1-29)

-As a family visit the cemetery (if it's too cold you can also stay in the car) to pray a Divine Mercy chaplet. There are great "pray-along" videos for this on YouTube.

-Look at pictures and share the memories with your children of your relatives who have passed away.

We believe that Christ has defeated death and given us hope for eternal life. Let us pray for the dead while remembering that the body of Christ consists of the Triumphant souls in Heaven, the poor souls in purgatory and the pilgrim souls on Earth. God bless you!
